Participants must be incarcerated at a participating institution and be within 12 months of release.

Windows to Work promotes self-sufficiency for individuals returning to the community through the development of constructive skills and the modification of thought processes related to criminal behavior.



Employment Coordinators Will Help You

- Establish an individual release/case plan
- With housing, food, clothing, transportation, etc.
- Address employment barriers such as transportation and education
- Look for jobs and assist with job retention activities
